In it Ellen described Jasmine as "Always just knowing when someone needs a little unspoken understanding and love." Below Ellen describes another example of just how true that statement is.



There is a special power between therapy dogs and some patients that is indescribable, and when we, as their fortunate handlers see that connection taking place, we just stand back and let it happen! I wanted to share a very heart-warming experience Jasmine and I had with one of the patients at Dobson House last week.

Every visit is gratifying. Every person we visit is special. But sometimes something happens that is an "OMG" moment and I get chills all over.

When Jasmine and I arrive at Dobson House, we go to the Nurses Station and ask them which patients' they feel would appreciate a visit from us. Not everyone cares for dogs, plus out of respect for their privacy or the stage of their illness, I value the nurses impute. I did that last Friday and there was a room the nurses didn't feel I should visit. However, as I was passing by that room, the patient's daughter came out in the hall and asked me if I would please come in. She said the family use to raise golden retrievers, and although her dad had been in a "very deep sleep" for several days, maybe he would sense Jasmine was there. As soon as we entered the room Jasmine seemed to focus on her dad. Jasmine looked at me, I said OK, and she went up to his bedside, and snuggled her nose under his hand. His daughter put his hand on Jasmine's head and started petting her head. Shortly, her father opened his eyes, started making happy noises, very slowly rolled toward Jasmine and started petting her. The family was cheering, crying and laughing. They were so happy and thanking Jasmine! They had all wanted to talk to their dad and their husband one more time! He petted Jasmine for a short time and continued to make happy noises. Then we left so he could be with his wife and children.







The following information has been included in previous CAAA Holiday newsletters. It's always worth reminding everyone again.

Holidays are for celebrating, gathering and eating. As much as we love our traditional dishes it's not a good idea to include the family pets in holiday dinners. Following is a list from the Humane Society webpage of food to keep away from them:

- Bones: Bones easily splinter and can cause serious health problems (even death) for your pet.
- **Candy:** Particularly chocolate—which is toxic to dogs, cats and ferrets—and any candy containing the toxic sweetener Xylitol.
- **Citrus and pits:** Foods such as cherry pits and peach pits contain essential oils that have the ability to cause irritations and even central nervous system depression if a significant amount is ingested.
- **Coffee:** Grounds, beans and chocolate-covered espresso beans.
- ◆ Eggs (raw)
- **Grapes and raisins:** These can cause kidney problems.
- ◆ **Leaves and stems:** From vegetables like tomatoes.
- Nuts
- Onions & Garlic
- ◆ Salt & Sugar

Trash: Pets who engage in trash-digging can accidentally eat foods that are potentially poisonous to them. Keep trash hidden somewhere your pet can't access. (NOTE: text in blue is a link to the Humane Society's listing of information of several other things including plants that may be poisonous to your pets)

The PETA website adds to their list "Holiday Foods That Are Bad For Dogs":

- Alcohol
- ◆ Caffeine
- Dairy (Milk and milk based products)
- Nuts and Nutmeg
- ♦ Yeast Dough

So what should you share with them? Try cooked sweet potatoes (minus any additional ingredients), baked potatoes, pumpkin purée, cucumbers, carrots (steamed or raw), steamed green beans, bananas, unsweetened cranberries, and apples (not the seeds) are all good choices—and not just during the holidays. Tell them it's all delicious, they'll believe you and eat it all up!
